

INTRODUCTION

Sūrah al-Ḥāqqah is the 69th sūrah in the Holy Qur'an and was the 88th to be revealed. This Makki surah is in the 29th juz and contains 52 ayaah, 262 words and 1,133 letters. Since the word, "al-Hāqqah", has occurred three times in its first three ayaah, it came to be called " Sūrah al-Hāqqah". The Arabic word, "ḥāqqah", is derived from the word, "ḥaqq" (the truth). It literally means what is inevitable, predestined, and real. "Al-hāqqah" in these ayaah refers to the Day of Resurrection. The sūrah is mainly concerned with the resurrection and its characterization, its inevitable occurrence, and the fate of people who denied it.

MERTIS AND BEENFITS

According to some hadiths, if a person recites sūrah al-Hāqqah, Allah (SwT) will ease the evaluation of his actions on the Day of Judgment, and the recitation of this sūrah in obligatory daily prayers as well as nafilas is an effect of the belief in God and the Prophet (S).

It is also narrated from the Noble Prophet (S) as saying that one who recites Sūrah al-Ḥāqqah, the burden of his sins shall be lessened.
