INTRODUCTION

Sūrah al-Naba' or Sūrah 'Amma or Sūrha al-Tasā'ul is a Makki sūrah. It is a relatively short Qur'anic sūrah. Sura al-Naba' is the first sūrah of the 30th juz'.

CONTENT

Sūrah al-Naba' talks about a great event or news, that is, the resurrection, arguing for its truth and indubitability. The sūrah begins by saying that people ask each other about the news of resurrection. It is followed by the warning that they will soon know about it.

The sūrah goes on to prove the truth of the resurrection. The world with its intelligent design is the best evidence for there being an Afterlife after this mortal world, which is the day of reward and punishment, rather than action. Then the events of the resurrection are characterized in this sūrah : all people will be present there and transgressors will endure a painful punishment and the pious will be rewarded with a permanent blessing.

MERITS

According to a hadith from the Holy Prophet (S), if someone recites Sūrah 'Amma yataasa'alun, Allah will saturate him with a cold and tasty drink of the Heaven after the resurrection. In another hadith, it is narrated that if someone recites and memorizes this Sūrah, his actions will be scrutinized after the resurrection so quickly that it will be like saying one prayer. There are also hadiths according to which the Prophet (S) has taken Sūrah an-Naba' as one of the Qura'nic Sūrahs that have whitened the Prophet's (s) hair.

INTERESTING FACT **وَالْجِبَالِ أَوْتَادًا**
